Luke 22:43-44;

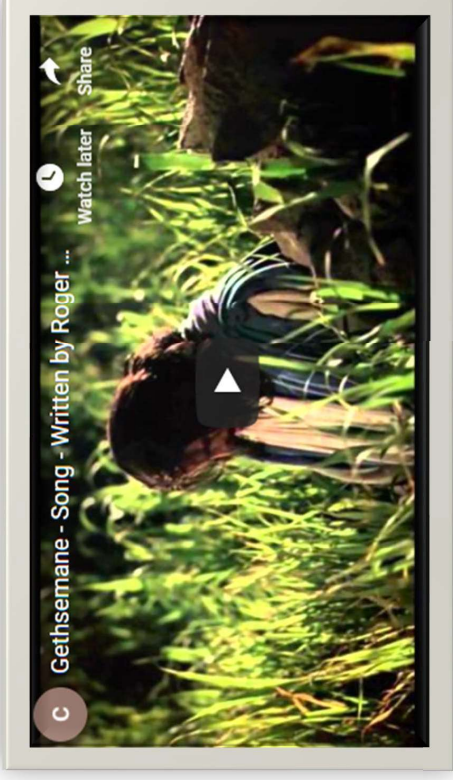
Mosiah 3:7

After you read these passages, consider recording what you discover in a chart like this one:

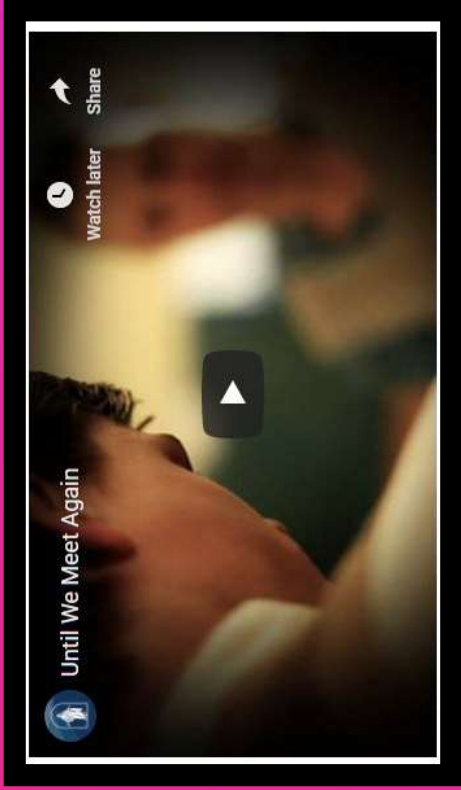
What did the Savior suffer?	Why did He suffer?	What does this mean to me?



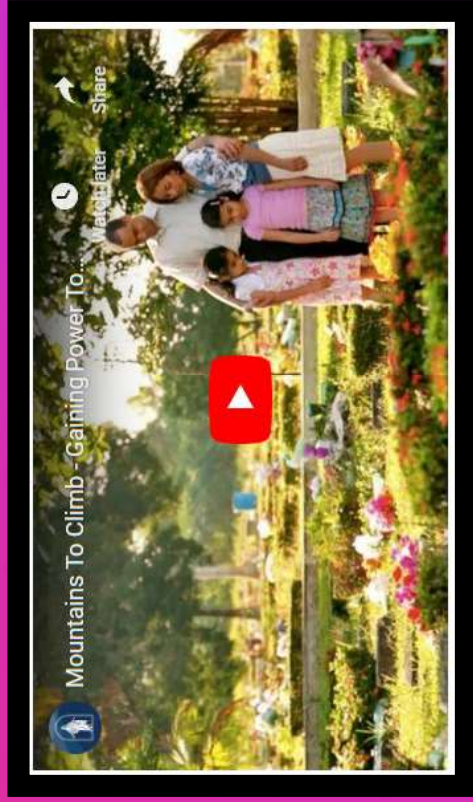
From the Living Christ we read: "We solemnly testify that His life, which is central to all human history, neither began in Bethlehem nor concluded on Calvary. He was the Firstborn of the Father, the Only Begotten Son in the flesh, the Redeemer of the world.

He rose from the grave to "become the firstfruits of them that slept" (1 Corinthians 15:20Links to an external site.). As Risen Lord, He visited among those He had loved in life. He also ministered among His "other sheep" (John 10:16Links to an external site.) in ancient America. In the modern world, He and His Father appeared to the boy Joseph Smith, ushering in the long-promised "dispensation of the fulness of times" (Ephesians 1:10Links to an external site.).

Easter Silent Lesson

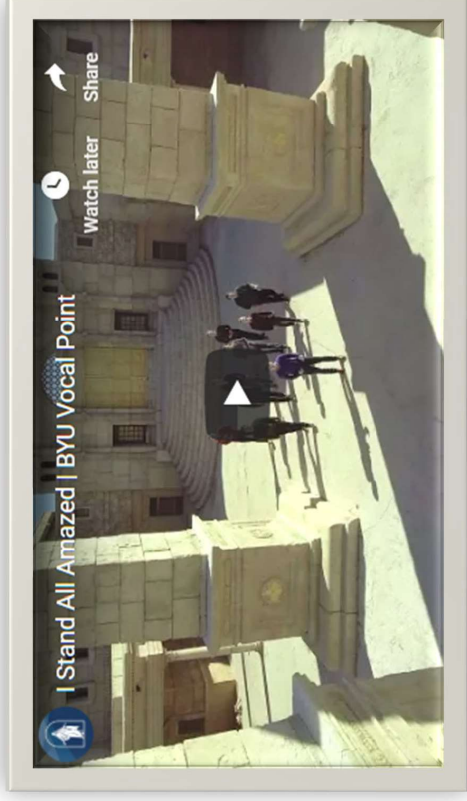


Because He suffered and died for us and was risen again on the third day, we can overcome our trials and challenges.
